MKO ex-member in Koln University Wednesday 02 Nov, 2016

On Saturday October 29th former member of the Mujahedin-e Khalq Organization (the MKO) addressed a seminar in Koln University.

Mr. Davoud Arshad member of “No to Terrorism and Cults Society” was invited to attend the seminar by the Union of students and scholars of Koln University.

Human Rights, Energy Crisis and Cultural Interactions were subjects discussed in the seminar. Mr. Arshad spoke on the relations between violation of human rights in cults and expansion of terrorism in the world.

As a victim of the MKO (the cult of Rajavi), Mr. Arshad describes how horribly members of the MKO particularly female members are victims of human rights abuses.

He explains that regarding the energy crisis and the consequent wars of energy in certain regions of the world such as Persian Gulf, the potential for appearance of terrorist extremists threatens the world. The ISIS and the MKO are examples of terrorist extremists that are used as proxies in the wars over energy in the Middle-East, implied Mr. Arshad.

“Terrorist groups like the Cult of Rajavi and the Islamic State have been producers of crisis in the region”, he added. “One of them created the crisis of Iran – Iraq war and the other is responsible for the current instability of the region.”

Mr. Arshad answered the questions of the audience on the MKO. He stated that the improvement of interactions of cultures between immigrants and hosting country prevents the isolation of immigrants and eventually reduces the opportunities for terrorist groups to recruit young immigrants.

He clarifies how the conflict over oil-rich regions paves the way for states like Saudi Arabia to exploit terrorists in order to accomplish its ambitions in the region. “Such terrorist cult have the capacity to be used by Saudi Arabia in a probable war with Iran”, he said about the MKO –as a terrorist group sponsored by Saudis. Mr. Arshad stressed that Saudi Arabia’s money keeps terrorists active in the conflicts.

Open letters to Axel Fischer, about MKO invitation to attend Rajavi's carnival on November 26

Vice-President of the Parliament Assembly and the Council of Europe and Chairman of the EPP Group

Dear Mr. Fischer,

As we have heard from the ranks of the MEK-outs in France, you are invited to the international gathering of the Peoples Mojahedin of Iran "Mojahedin-e Khalq" (MEK / PMOI / MKO) and its political arm, the "National Council of Resistance of Iran (NCRI)" on November 26th in Paris.

We urge you to refrain from participating in this event!

The MEK is a cult organization being in fire for serious human rights violations against their members (according to a HRW-report) and the dubious handling of critics and dropouts.

Especially the refugees from CampLiberty in Iraq, who were relocated to Albania, are especially in the focus of the leadership of the organization to be influenced. The MEK tries everything to keep their members in Albania under control and to prevent their integration in society outside the organization.

In recent years due to its dubious reputation the MEK strives intensively to international political appreciation. They call themselves "the Iranian Resistance", but within the serious political opposition groups inside Iran, they do not matter. They are also despised by the majority of the Iranian people for their cooperation with the former Iraqi dictator Saddam Hussein. The "Third Way" – the overthrow of the political system inside Iran by the Iranian people and their organized resistance (the MEK) – propagated by Rajavi, is utopian for that reason alone, the MEK has virtually no support among the Iranian people.

The assertion the MEK can be a serious alternative to the current Iranian regime, is merely the wishful thinking of the MEK and its lobbyists.

That's why they are trying to misuse the media for their own purposes deliberately and to spread their view of reality in the international media.

Also the removal from the US list of Foreign Terrorist Organizations in



2012 was not a political development but the result of a multi-million dollar public relations- and media campaign of the MEK. Both in Iraq, as well as in the US, the MEK tries to place lobbyists in major media in order to influence the reporting.

The Gathering simply is a propaganda event for the MEK themselves and their "President elected" Maryam Rajavi. It is all about to enhance the MEKs international reputation and to interfere with the rapprochement course towards the Western world and Iran.

Even as a well-intentioned humanitarian gesture for the members of the MEK, your participation in this event would be counterproductive, because the simple members are the first who have to suffer from an appreciation of the MEK.

Your participation in this event as Vice-President of the Parliament Assembly and the Council of Europe, nor benefits the people of Iran, neither the MEK members living in

Albania. The only one who would benefit from your participation, are Mrs. Maryam Rajavi and her MEK leadership!

RC: MEK members in Albania have no access to the outside world

Mujahedin-e Khalq members have had no contact with the outside world for the last 35 years. They have had no contact with their families. Members are held hostages within the MKO Cult camps. The whereabouts of some are even unknown to their families.

Mr. Mir Bagher Sedaghi has been seeking to find a way to visit his brother who is living at Mujahedin-e khalq Camp in Tirana, Albania.

He perused the issue through the Red Cross office of Bern.

The Red Cross officials reported him their several months of perusing the case, last week.

Mr. Sedaghi reiterated the Red Cross report:

“More than twenty Iranian families living in Swiss have contacted us during the last year. They asked us to help them with sending their letters to their family members at MKO Camp in Tirana. We perused the subject through the Red Cross office of Tirana. The Red Cross office of Tirana sent us an email. The email reads:

“ the MEK is a closed cult. They don't allow us to contact the members of the group. We couldn't contact any member of the group. We just could hand the letters to the MEK officials. However we know that the letters have not reached the members. The MEK members in Albania are not allowed to have phone, Internet or TV. They have no access to the outside world and we can do nothing for them. ... ”

6 Years ago Today:

CIA, Mossad and MEK Assassinated Iran's Top Nuclear Scientist Majid Shahriari

Thursday 01 Dec, 2016

This November 28th is the sixth anniversary of the assassination of leading Iranian nuclear scientist Majid Shahriari, whose death represented a particularly disgraceful episode in the attempts made by Israel's Mossad intelligence service to interfere with and damage Iran's peaceful nuclear research program. Shahriari, who reportedly had no connection to any possible military applications in his research,

sad planned and prepared the killing of Shahriari and the others, attacks which were almost certainly carried out by associates of the radical Marxist group Mujaheddin e Khalq (MEK).

The assassinations were based on the false premise that Iran had a nuclear weapons program that could be disrupted by killing the scientists and technicians involved. Two comprehensive studies by the American government's Cen-

tral Intelligence Agency (CIA) conducted in 2007 and 2012 determined that no such program existed and that Iran had never taken any serious steps to initiate such research. Israel was also aware that there was no program. Nevertheless, the Israeli government, sometimes working in collusion with the American CIA, took steps to interfere with Iran's existing and completely legal and open to inspection atomic energy program by identifying then killing its scientists and introducing viruses into its computer systems. This was in spite of the fact that Iran was fully compliant with international norms on nuclear research and it was a signatory to the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty (NPT), which Israel, possessing its own nuclear arsenal, had refused to sign.

As a result of last year's signing of the Joint Comprehensive Plan of Action (JCPOA) between Iran and the so-called

P5+1 consisting of the United States, Russia, China, France, Britain, and the European Union, any remaining concerns that Tehran might even be considering the development of a nuclear weapons program were greatly diminished. Iran



was the most prominent of the four Iranian nuclear scientists and technicians who were killed by terrorists between 2010 and 2012. He was a leader in the development of Iran's atomic power research and development program and was internationally respected for his expertise in quantum physics and neutron transport.

Within the international intelligence community, it has been generally understood that Mos-

tral Intelligence Agency (CIA) conducted in 2007 and 2012 determined that no such program existed and that Iran had never taken any serious steps to initiate such research. has since that time been in compliance with the agreement, possible nuclear proliferation has been avoided, and, apart from the fulminations of certain anti-Iranian politicians in the United States, the signatories to the agreement have expressed their complete satisfaction with the outcome. It is now up to Washington to live up to its part of the agreement by easing remaining restrictions that are being imposed against Iranian financial institutions and

regarding the purchase of some commercially available dual use technologies.

But in spite of the relative stability provided by the JCPOA, the meticulously planned and executed death of Shahriari must not be forgotten, if only to remind the world of the ruthlessness which Mossad and other intelligence agencies often pursue their targets even when those they victimize do not really constitute actual threats. Majid Shahriari was killed one morning as he was driving into work in Tehran. He was in a Peugeot that was making its way slowly through the heavy rush hour traffic when a motorcycle pulled up next to him as it weaved its way among the cars. The motorcyclist attached a bomb to the Peugeot's window before he drove off and detonated the device by remote control from a distance. Shahriari died in the blast and two other occupants of the vehicle were injured. At the same time, another car in another part of Tehran was attacked in the same fashion, though the couple inside realized what was happening and managed to get out. They too were injured.

Majid Shahriari left behind a scientist wife and two young children. It should be observed that even though MEK was the likely perpetrator of the attacks, the technical aspects of the operation were far beyond its limited capabilities. First of all, it was necessary to identify the scientists who were to be targeted, no simple task as the

Iranian government and atomic energy agency would have taken steps to restrict such information. Only a major foreign intelligence service would have had the capability to penetrate secure government communications to learn who the scientists were and where they lived, to permit an attack to be planned and executed. Both CIA and Mossad would have had such capability and both are also known to have contact with MEK, a relationship that was and still is particularly close in the case of the Israelis.

After identifying the targets and working out a plan for connecting with them it would have been necessary to engage in extensive surveillance to make sure that the approach and timing would work flawlessly. That would require time, training, and money to support the activity, exactly the sort of thing that a state sponsored intelligence agency would be good at. Then it was necessary to devise the bombs to be used to kill the targets. This was no simple matter in practice because the bombs that were put together were highly sophisticated and designed to kill all the occupants of the vehicle. They were shaped charges that directed the blast into the car and they also incorporated small metal projectiles that would fill the target vehicle with a lethal spray.

Among intelligence agencies Israel has the best deserved reputation for being an organi-

zation that favors the use of assassinations, so the suggestion that it was behind the killing of Shahriari and several of his colleagues as well as the attempted assassinations of others fits neatly into the Mossad modus operandi. The United States, also no friend of Iran, almost certainly provided support to other programs like the creation of the Stuxnet virus that crippled Iran's scientific computers, but would likely balk at the assassination of civilian scientists. Israel would have no such misgivings and has, in fact, killed civilians in all the countries that surround it.

Majid Shahriari certainly should be remembered for his exemplary work as a scientist, but his assassination should also be a reminder that Israel makes up its own rules and its ruthlessness in dealing with its neighbors should be clearly and candidly recognized for what it is.

Dan Benjamin reviews the history of the Mujahideen-e Khalq (MEK) and its support from many American former officials and politicians:

Even more unsettling was the sheer creepiness of the group. While Maryam Rajavi was presiding over enormous conferences with American political celebrities and seas of smiling, waving people in Paris, at Camp Ashraf, the MeK leadership treated its people appallingly. Visitors, including from the U.N., painted a picture of relentless intimidation, shaming and coercion of the inhabitants by camp leaders [bold mine-DL]. The MeK, which is often described as a cult, had a long history of requiring that its members divorce and remain celibate. Now, it leaders were resolved that the group would remain together and none of the members would be relocated individually or in small groups—the Ashraf group was a bargaining chip that the leadership was cynically using for future leverage.

One of the more troubling things about American MEK


supporters is their willingness to whitewash the group's past as well as its present-day behavior. They aren't content to work with an avowedly bad group against a common enemy, but feel compelled to pretend that the group is upstanding and noble. At an appearance in Paris last year, Giuliani called the cult leader Maryam Rajavi a "hero," which either suggests that his understanding of heroism is extremely poor or that he will say anything to get paid.

It is hardly the first time that supporters of regime change in another country have aligned themselves with a disreputable group to pursue their goal, but the sheer dishonesty or credulity required to present a totalitarian cult as a group dedicated to freedom and democracy is nonetheless remarkable.

This is perhaps the most insidious part of the MEK boosterism we have seen over the last few years: endorsing their makeover as a "secular, demo-

cratic" group and pretending that a group that has virtually no support inside Iran is the country's "real" opposition. This is not only false, but it also does a real disservice to the Iranian opposition in Iran that wants reform rather than regime change. It also demonstrates contempt for and hostility to the people of Iran, since this same group is responsible for killing so many Iranians when it was serving Saddam Hussein. Above all, it attempts to promote the lie that a policy of regime change is supported by Iranians in order to lend that dangerous and destructive goal the appearance of some legitimacy.

Trump's top picks for key posts back anti-Iran terror group

A number US President-elect Donald Trump's top nominees for sensitive national security posts have accepted money from notorious anti-Iran terrorist group known as Mujahedin-e Khalq Organization (MKO) and lobbied for the group's removal from the US list of terrorist groups.

Describing MKO as "bizarre and brutal" with "plenty of American blood on its hands, as well as that of thousands of Iranians killed while the group was a strike force serving [former Iraqi dictator] Saddam Hussein" during his war on Iran in the 1980s, US-based magazine Politicorevealed in a Saturday report that former New York City's Mayor Rudy Giuliani and former US ambassador to the UN John Bolton, who are on Trump's shortlist of nominees for Secretary of State and director of national intelligence, were on MKO's payroll and lobbied to

erase the group from the State Department's list of terrorist groups during Hillary Clinton's tenure as the top US diplomat.

According to the report, the MKO paid Giuliani "handsomely for years" giving him "\$20,000 or more and possibly a lot more for brief appearance before the [Paris-based] group" and for lobbying to

delist them from Foreign Terrorist Groups (FTO) in 2012.

Earlier this month, The New York Times quoted Giuliani as admitting that he was "one of dozens of prominent Americans who worked for" MKO, receiving "payments at the same time it was on a State Department list designating it a terrorist organization" while persuading the Obama administration to revoke its terrorist listing.

"My ties to them are very open," Giuliani said. "We worked very hard to get them delisted — by Hillary Clinton, by the way."

This is while a US Treasury Department probe in 2012 examined whether speaking fees paid by several MKO front groups to a long list of American politicians,



including Giuliani and lawmakers, violated laws barring US citizens from receiving money from designated terrorist organizations.

The magazine further identifies other high-profile nominees for high administration positions that have supported or lobbied on behalf of the terrorist group, including former Speaker of the

House, Newt Gingrich, ex-labor Secretary Elaine Chao (also the wife of Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell) as well as former Bush security aide Fran Townsend, whose name has been mentioned as a possible Secretary of Homeland Security or director of national intelligence in the future administration.

The report also underlined that in addition to "longtime regime-change advocates" in the US such as Bolton, "who recently boasted before a MKO crowd in Paris that he had been engaged with them for a decade," the terror group signed up Republican and Democratic politicians en masse.

It further identified other pro-MKO politicians such as former Attorney General Michael Mukasey, former Homeland Security Secretary Tom

Ridge, former FBI Director Louis Freeh, former DNC chair Howard Dean, former Chairman of the Joint Chiefs Hugh Shelton, former Obama National Security Adviser General

Jim Jones, former Pennsylvania Governor Ed Rendell, adding that the list "went on and on."

The US State Department added the MKO to its list of foreign terrorist organizations in 1997 for the group's involvement in the killing of Americans in Iran in the 1970s and an attack on US soil in 1992.
